We hope you had a great summer and are looking forward to discovering lots of new things this year. We are looking forward to teaching your child and have included a few suggestions below about how you can help us with your child's learning.

<u>Reading</u>: Your child is expected to read daily at home for 15 minutes— this boosts children's self-esteem and helps to create a life long love of literature. By reading together every day, you stimulate and strengthen your child's language and literacy skills. By reading and talking with your child each day, you bond with them and model the love of reading, which will benefit them in school and throughout life. That small window of time in a busy day can also boost relationships and is known to reduce stress and anxiety. Please sign your child's reading record to show that you have listened to them read - your support is vital. Children are able to change their books as often as they want, but in Year 3 we would expect this to be *at least once* a week.

<u>PE:</u> PE kit needs to be in school every day in case there is a change to the timetable. Their PE kit should consist of both outdoor and indoor clothing. Please, please, please name everything this will help us to return items to you if they get lost!

<u>Forest School:</u> your child will attend regular sessions during this year and more information will be sent home soon. As there are brambles and nettles in the Forest School area it is essential they wear the correct clothing (wellies, a long sleeved top and trousers). A coat is required for wet weather.
