




# **EXPLORING EARTH FROM SPACE**



#### **AUTUMN TERM SPORTS ROUND UP!**

Wow! What a busy term of sporting events here at Kingsway Primary School. Our children have been involved with QLC cricket, QLC B team football, house cross-country, whole school Daily Mile as part of the county record attempt for most pupils running the Daily Mile in one day and Gloucester School Sports Network events. Kingsway Primary School is proud to be members of the Gloucester School Sport Network (GSSN) and have been able to give many children opportunities to represent Kingsway at the following events: KS1 Panathlon Challenge,



Year 3 New Age Kurling and Bouccia Festival, Gloucester Primary School Cross-Country Championships, School Games Sportshall Athletics and Year 2 Christmas Multi-Skills



At the Gloucester Primary School Cross-Country Championships we had 59 children representing Kingsway at the event from Year 2 to 6. Our Year 2 team were particularly successful with a 3<sup>rd</sup> Place finish as a team – making our Year 2 team the 3<sup>rd</sup> best Year 2 runners in Gloucester. Individual runners received personal success with two Year 6 girls Taylor and Ruby receiving Gloucester City selection places to go through to the County Cross-Country in the New Year if they choose to. Taylor ran a very strong and controlled race with an outstanding 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish which not only gave her a silver medal but makes her the second fasted Year 6 girl in Gloucester! Exceptionally proud.

Our school Football and Netball Teams have been busy with their league matches as part of the Gloucester Primary School Football Association (GPSFA). The Football team have had some unlucky scores which haven't always reflected the standard of play and are currently 6<sup>th</sup> with 10 points after playing 7 games so far. The Netball Team have had more success with a mixture of wins and losses over the first half of the season and are currently 3<sup>rd</sup> with 10 points after 6 games with two games left to play in the new year.



Kingsway took a strong team to compete at the Sportshall, Athletics School Games on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November where children showed skill and ability in track and field events throughout the afternoon finishing middle of the pack.



Finally both our Year 2 classes went for a fun Christmas themed Multi-skills Sports morning at Oxstalls Sports Park. The children were well behaved and demonstrated great control of movements and skills. Four children also received prizes for the Christmas hat competition.

That makes it a staggering 92 children going out to represent the school in sporting events in this first term alone and all children participating in a physically active event here at school either as part of the Daily Mile Day or the House Cross Country Championships.
