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Dear Parents/Carers

End of term arrangements

I hope you are all well and are managing to make the most of the sunny weather when and where you can.

As has been the case throughout the lockdown, announcements from Government that affect us all have come thick and fast but the actual detail needs consideration. I am proud of our school teams and our community during this time: the support for each other has been noticeable with many going above and beyond to help wherever they can. I give my thanks to all the staff at the school—the team has been exceptional during this time.

I am writing to give you some clear and simple updates about the end of this term and the start of the next. They are based on what we know: we will give you more information as it arrives and many of these will be supplemented with other, direct communication.

Transition between classes

Current Reception and Year 1 only: Your child will be informed of their new class teacher on Monday, 6th July. This will allow their new teacher to introduce themselves to the class during this week and we will send home a little message from the teacher via Class Dojo for parents and all those children who are not currently in school.

Current year 2—5: All other classes will be informed of their new teacher on Monday, 13th July. During this week, we are open to Years 2—5 and we hope that many children will join us to end the year. This will allow time for transition preparation as well as a welcome back to school. New teachers will introduce themselves to their classes briefly with more extensive transition work taking place in September.

We have been in close contact with the secondary schools. They each have slightly different arrangements and, in addition to talking with us, will be making contact with you directly.

September

The current commentary from DfE seems to suggest that all children will be back full time from September. Whilst this is not absolutely confirmed at this point, I am sure you will join me in crossing fingers that this is the case and that we can return to some sense of normality. We will, of course, keep you informed.

We know that our curriculum and our teaching will need to adjust for loss of learning and experience for the children. To cater for this, we have created two specialist teams within the school:

A Recovery Mental Health Team: taking best practice and research locally and nationally and using this to support individuals, groups and the whole school community on their return. During the first weeks of term, our focus will be reintegration, settling and adjusting back to school life. We will also assess any individual or group needs, to provide targeted support where needed.

A Recovery Curriculum Team: taking best practice and research locally and nationally to enable rapid learning to take place and to support children in 3 ways:

- 1. Revisiting learning that may have been lost—regression
- 2. Understanding how well learning from the summer term and home learning from the summer term have been remembered.
- 3. Providing a curriculum from terms 1—6 of next year that supports meaningful and paced catch-up and prioritises key learning areas such as reading and key groups such as any disadvantaged learners.

We are proud of the work we have done so far and realise there is more to do as the term unfolds. But, we have a great team and clear plan to support the children, and you, next year.



Learning in Geography has focussed on imports and exports across the world, whilst in art the children have created beautiful artwork based on rotational symmetry and spent time enjoying the good
